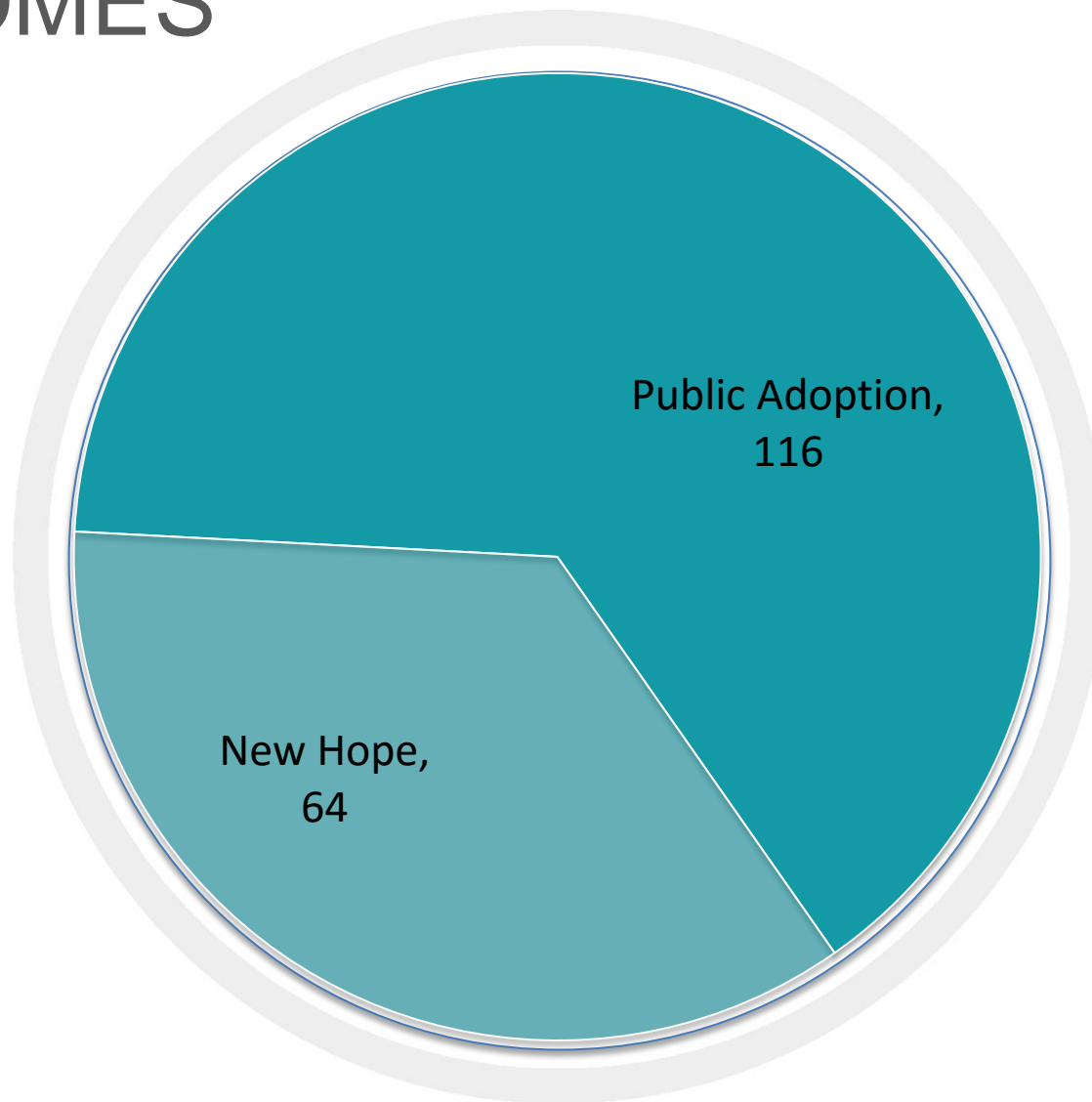

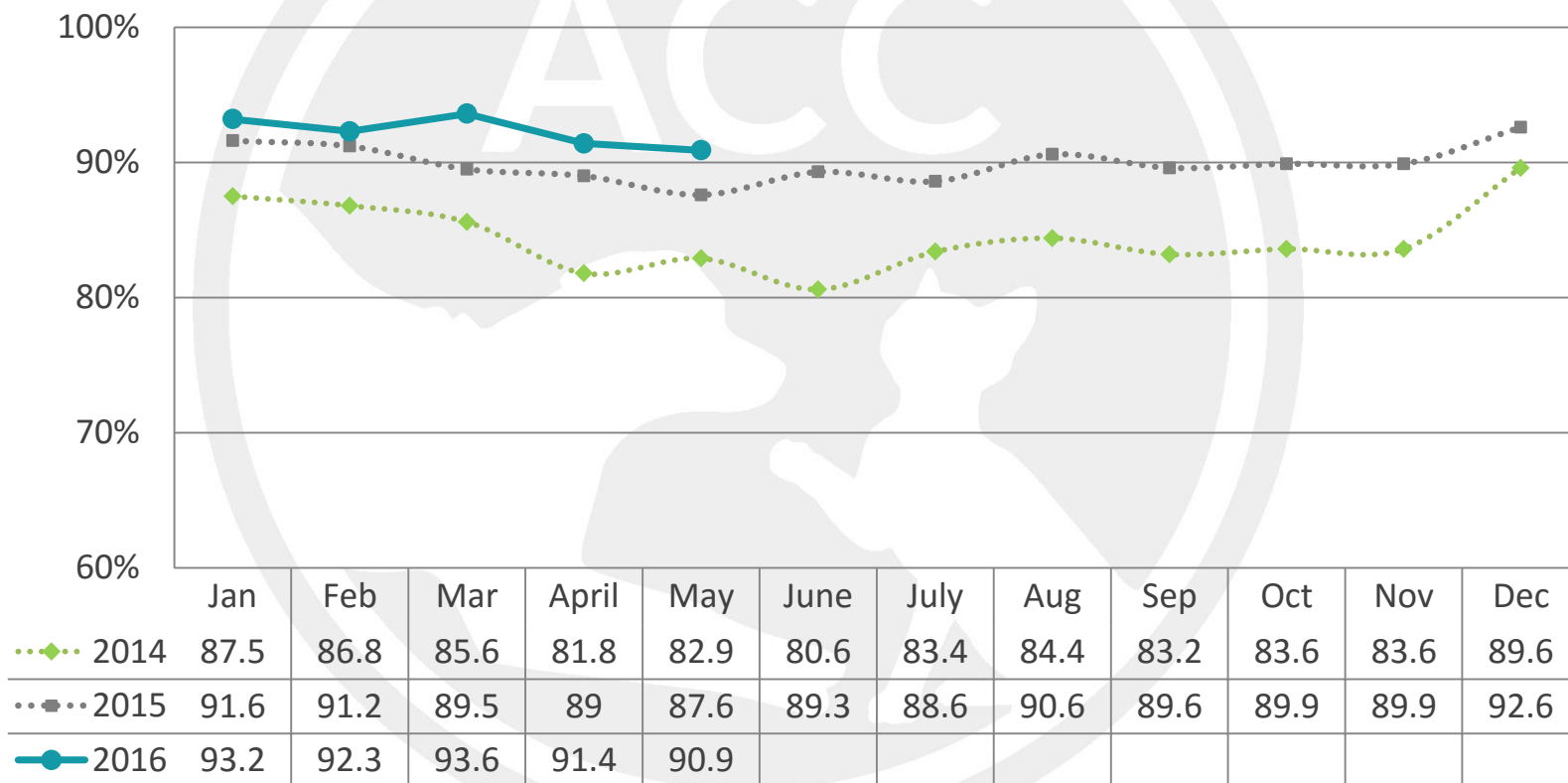

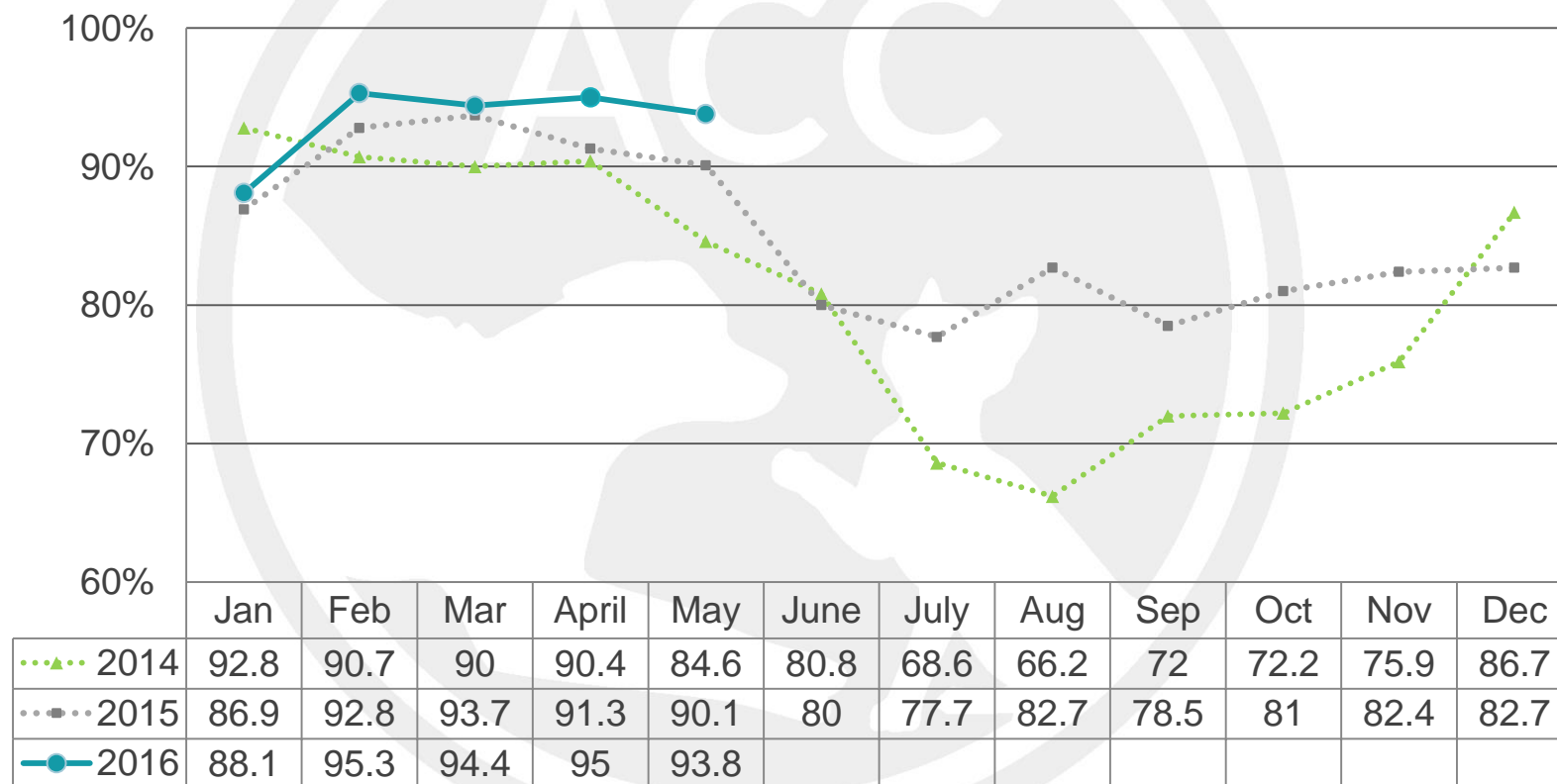
Placement Rate

Recognizing the link between physical environment and animal health with innovative design

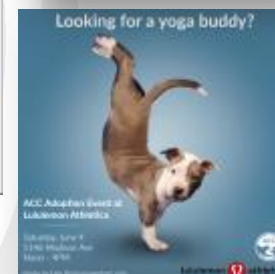
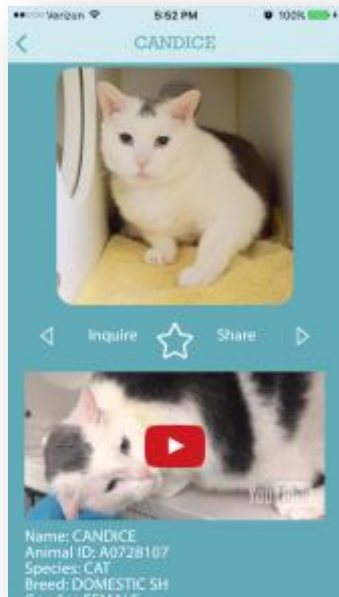
- Separate air-zones to minimize cross-contamination

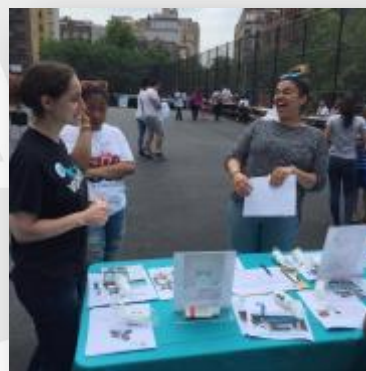

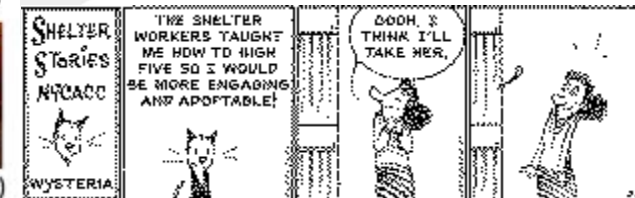
