Animal Care & Control of NYC (AC&C) is celebrating “St. Patrick’s Day” March 15<sup>th</sup> through 17<sup>th</sup>. During the special at AC&C, cats can be adopted for \$10, dogs for \$40, rabbits for \$35, kittens six months and under for \$50, and puppies six months and under for \$75.

All AC&C adoptions include vaccinations, a preregistered microchip, spay/neuter, a free office visit at a participating veterinarian and a free identification tag.
