Dog Thrown Away in the Trash Is Now Ready for Adoption

(New York, August 25, 2011) – Back in June, a severely emaciated dog was thrown out with the trash. When an AC&C staffer arrived, the dog’s condition was so bad that she, later affectionately named Ella, couldn’t walk and could barely raise her head. The Animal Control Officer immediately transported her to an Animal Care & Control of NYC shelter. The AC&C medical team provided Ella the care needed to save her life. She was provided excellent care in her foster home and is now ready for her new home.

“Ella was provided the care she needed by the donations to the Special Treatment and Recovery Program (STAR) and great foster parents,” said Julie Bank, executive director of AC&C. “Ella has made a remarkable recovery and looks like a completely new dog.”
